GIRLS GIVING GRANTS GRANT GUIDELINES AND PROCESS

Overview: Girls Giving Grants, the youth enterprise of Impact Austin, is changing the face of giving. We are a grantmaking cooperative, funded and operated by young women in grades 8 - 12. Our mission is to know and to serve our community. Our members each contribute a \$125 annual donation, with \$100 combined to directly fund grants, which are awarded in April of each year to a local nonprofit organization. We want our funds to make a visible difference in our community. We award grants to charitable programs or projects that benefit youth within Travis, Hays, Bastrop and/or Williamson counties. The programs or projects must strengthen, improve, enhance, and positively impact the lives of children and youth in the greater Austin area. The members of Girls Giving Grants will choose the recipient of the grant. All the money contributed by the members goes to fund these grants; any funds used to operate Girls Giving Grants have been raised from other sources. Girls Giving Grants' funding cycle runs from October 1st of one year to September 30th of the next year. In each funding year, proposals are solicited and evaluated from October through April and grants are awarded in April. The exact amount of funds available for award in any given funding year will be announced on or after October 1st.

Eligibility: To be eligible for a grant, an organization must be classified as a "public charity" with tax-exempt status under Sec/on 501(c)(3) and 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Service Code. In addition, the organization's proposal must:

- Outline a project or program that targets a specific youth population for a specific duration and with specific measurable goals to be achieved;
- Provide services in Travis, Hays, Bastrop and/or Williamson counties, Texas;
- Use the full amount of the Girls Giving Grants' available grant; and
- Plan to expend the grant funds within 12 months of receipt of the grant.

Types of Programs We Will Not Consider:

- General operating expenses
- Debt reduction
- Endowments or memorials
- Bridge funding or interim financing
- Operational deficits
- Partisan, political lobbying or legislative activities
- Fraternal, sectarian, and religious organizations where the grant is intended for the principal benefit of the organization's own members or adherents, or where the grant is intended for inherently religious activities
- Private foundations
- Legal expenses incurred in any action by or against the organization
- General construction or renovation (unrelated to a specific proposed project or program)
- General capital campaigns (unrelated to a specific proposed project or program)

- Fundraising activities or events
- Advertising
- Sports teams or any sports-related activity or competition

Our guidelines are continuing to evolve, and Girls Giving Grants reserves the right to change its criteria without prior notice at any time.

Other Restrictions:

- An organization may submit only one application each year.
- An organization that has received a grant from Girls Giving Grants may not reapply in the following year.

Review Process: Girls Giving Grants has a two-part Grant Application process:

1. **Grant Application:** Due early November via online submission. See g3 website for specifics.
 - Create Agency Profile
 - Or if you already have a login, login to Impact Austin's Grant Management System

In February, Girls Giving Grants will select finalists for site visits, and you will be notified in writing and by phone if your organization has been selected for a site visit.
2. **Site Visit Conducted by Membership:** A site visit of each finalist is extremely important because it allows our members to gain a full-color picture of your organization and its proposal, beyond the printed page of your application. The site visit allows us to gather crucial information, observe your organization's operations, and gain a deeper understanding of the project proposal. The site visit allows each member to be educated first-hand on a nonprofit and its proposed program and each of our members is required to attend a site visit. The site visit allows for an educated comparison among each finalist during the final determination. Site visits will be conducted in April and must be on a weekend date so as not to interfere with the academic schedules of our members. A site visit shall last no longer than two (2) hours in duration. For your organization to be considered as a grant recipient, it must be willing to accommodate a site visit on a Saturday. We will request that you reserve a specific Saturday, that will be communicated to you and on the g3 website. After all the finalist site visits have been conducted and results shared with all members over the next few weeks, the Girls Giving Grants' members then vote on the finalists, with each member casting one vote and the majority deciding the grant recipient. The grant recipient is then notified in writing and by phone. The grant award and ceremony are generally made in concert with the Impact Austin annual meeting.

Girls Giving Grants reserves the right to reject a Grant Application for any reason, including if it is late or incomplete in any way.

Terms of Grant: Prior to receiving the grant money, the grant recipient must execute Girls Giving Grants' Terms of Grant.

Evaluations: Girls Giving Grants requires that the grant recipient submit periodic progress reports. Girls Giving Grants uses the periodic progress reports to measure program progress and outcomes, promote learning from experience, improve program performance and encourage our grant recipients to build effective self-evaluation plans into their projects.
